Dear trail enthusiast.

The Maine Trail Advisory Committee (MTAC) has made some big changes in the RTP program, and most of it involves *more money* for your project!

- After nearly ten years of a stagnant maximum grant amount, the MTAC has increased the maximum grant request to \$50,000 per project.
- MTAC eliminated the "motorized trail with bridge" category enabling applicants to apply for up to \$100,000.
- Replacing this is a "Project of Significance" (POS) category. Within this category we will entertain applications of up to a maximum of \$120,000 in each of the Motorized, Non-Motorized and Diverse project categories.
 - o Only one POS may be awarded per category, and not every category may have a POS award.

Finally, the emphasis on pre-application site visits has been replaced with four regional RTP application workshops across the state (see below). If you are interested in learning more about the new RTP program and how to increase your organizations' chances for funding, attending one of these workshops will be a great first step.
